Research Ecosystem**

Chanakya University, seeks to pioneer the vision of NEP 2020, in facilitating comprehensive, contextual and contemporary education system based on student centric methodology and Outcome based assessments. Beyond the confines of courses, certifications and domains, it is about building competence, compassion, culture and collaboration. The Inter, Multi and Trans disciplinary approach of project based learning is aimed at addressing real world problems through sustainable solutions. The unique model of Academic Portfolio Management offers students the opportunity to choose from many fields of knowledge instead of being restricted to a single domain of learning. The disciplines of Science, Humanities, Technology, Sports and Art, seamlessly merge to curate new fields of knowledge.

At Chanakya, every course is embedded with Social, Technological, Ethical and Professional orientation. It is our efforts to integrate professional outcome orientation to any program of studies, from Science, Humanities, Art to Technology. As Social sciences orient them towards social reality, art facilitates creative expression, while science instils rationality and technology enables the skill of application, hence, a holistic education is about a competent application and a conscious transformation of behaviour.

Humanities and social sciences bring meaning and purpose to skills acquired. They hold the key to working with people and for people. Hence, at Chanakya, studying the humanities is not optional; it is a foundation. We believe that becoming a professional is not enough, one must first become a human being. The sciences teach us to understand the world, but the humanities teach us to understand ourselves and others. They give perspective and depth enough to see the nuances.

At the undergraduate level, the baskets focus on four dimensions of growth:

## Majors

The majors is the heart of the degree program. It is the subject in which a student chooses to specialize. Major courses begin with introductory classes that build a strong foundation and then progress toward advanced study where students learn to apply their knowledge in real and creative ways.

For example, a student of economics may begin by learning basic principles of markets and trade, then move on to designing and advocating policy to reduce income inequality in developing countries thus, connect theoretical knowledge for real world solutions. This gradual journey, starting from the basics and moving toward advanced exploration, ensures that students not only know their subject but also learn how to apply it thoughtfully and productively.

## Minors

At Chanakya University, academic design is intentionally interdisciplinary. Alongside their chosen major, students pursue a minor, a structured set of courses in another field, ensuring breadth alongside depth. This framework reflects our belief that scholarship thrives at the intersections of disciplines.

A minor allows a physics student to engage with history, a psychology student to examine political theory, or a business student to explore Sanskrit texts. These combinations are not ornamental; they cultivate intellectual agility. A pairing of computer science and philosophy equips students to navigate the ethical dimensions of technology.

By design, no student graduates with a narrow education. The minor system embeds intellectual range into every degree, preparing graduates to approach complex questions with insight drawn from multiple traditions of thought.

## Studio Courses

These are unique and immersive learning experiences that reimagine the traditional classroom. Studios are curated courses that emphasize practical design and solution-oriented learning. Discussions, dialogues, interactive sessions, and project-based work form the core pedagogical approaches in these classrooms.

These capsule courses are designed with a focused and intensive curriculum, enabling students to gain deep knowledge within a short span of time. They ensure in-depth exposure to concepts and knowledge systems, carefully crafted to provide intellectual rigor and real-world relevance.

Popular offerings include Edible Innovations: The Science Behind Sustainable Eating, Entrepreneurial Storytelling and Branding: Crafting a Strong Business Identity in India, Biomimicry – Nature-Inspired Design Thinking and Innovation, and Creative Coding: Exploring Art, Interaction, and Data, among others.

The Chair's mission is to shape thinkers, educators, and leaders who can carry India's intellectual heritage into the modern world contributing to nation-building with purpose and integrity.

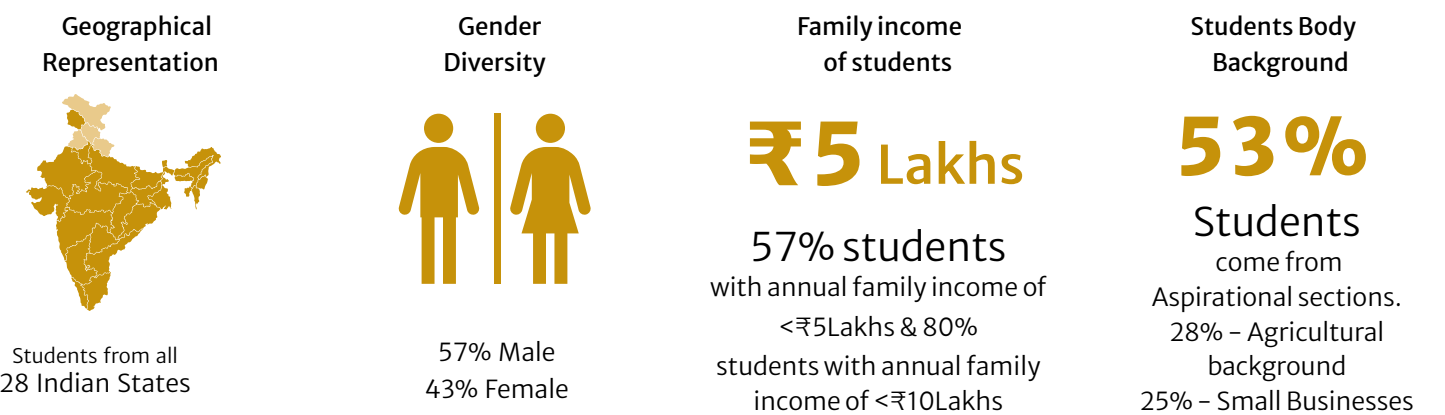

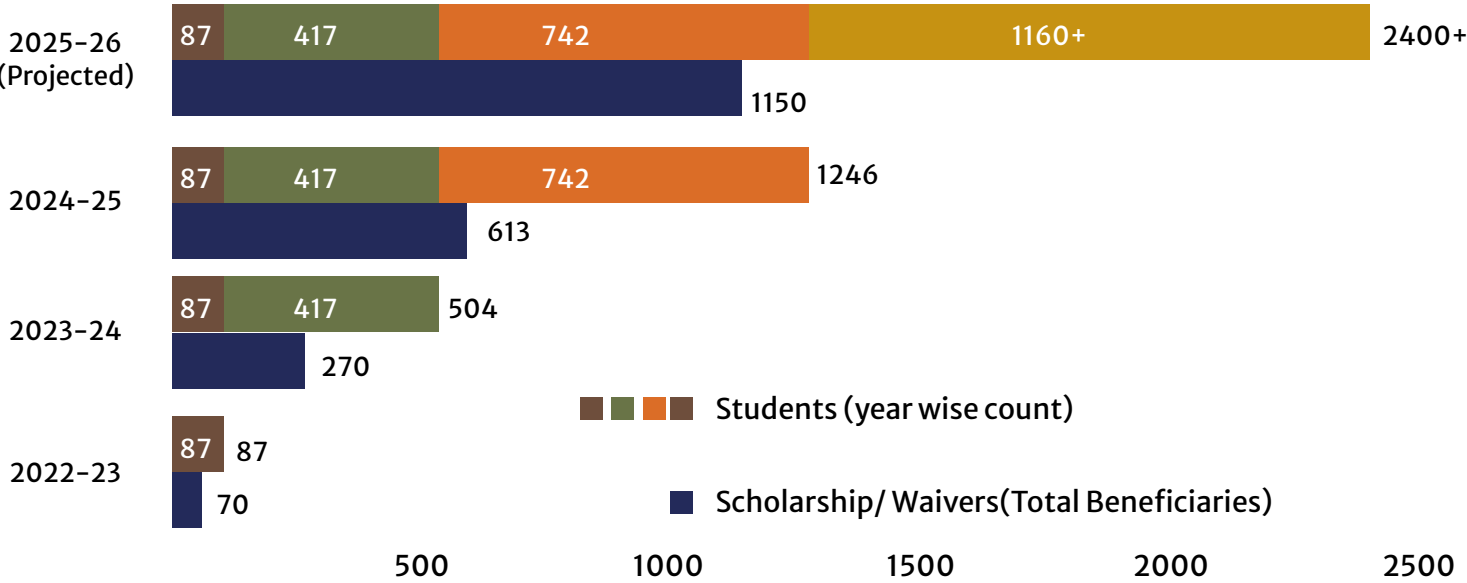
