Research Articles	6,000–8,000 words	Original theoretical, empirical, or methodological contributions; double-blind peer review.
Review / Conceptual Articles	4,000–6,000 words	Critical literature reviews, conceptual interventions, or framework-building articles; editorial review, with external expert consultation where appropriate.
Policy and Field Essays	2,500–4,000 words	Analytical, evidence-based essays or field reports linking contemporary developments with wider regional questions; editorial review with external expert consultation where required.
Neighbourhood Briefs	1,500–2,500 words	Focused analysis of an unfolding country, borderland, or subregional development; editorial review.
Book Reviews / Review Essays	800–1,200 / 2,000–3,000 words	Reviews of recent scholarly and serious non-fiction works relevant to the journal's scope; editorial review.
Oral and Visual Narratives	Flexible	Curated oral histories, maps, timelines, satellite imagery, trade-flow visualisations, and multimedia narratives; prior editorial consultation recommended.

- Anonymised manuscript plus a separate title page with author details and ORCID iD
- 150–200-word abstract with five to seven keywords
- Chicago Manual of Style, 18th edition, author-date citations and references
- Generative-AI use disclosed; similarity index within 15 per cent
- Funding, conflict-of-interest, and ethics declarations where applicable

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
